Since I commented on the good weather, in last month's report, it has done nothing but rain! The cold, damp weather has not put us off learning outdoors and we have enjoyed a wide range of activities including using small sticks to make kites to fly at the park and rafts to float in the river.

On Thursday May 6th the hall was used as a Polling Station, so we arranged a day trip rather than losing another day's pre-schooling. We "made camp" at Welford Park Cricket Club from where we walked down to Welford House and around the wonderful grounds. We admired the safari garden art of giraffes and a cheetah, played Pooh sticks on the bridge, walked through the bamboo trail and around the woods. Back at the cricket club we ate lunch and had time for a quick introduction to cricket! We have been learning about mini-beasts and have painted some super artwork depicting the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar. We have some caterpillars spinning their cocoons at the hall; when they hatch into butterflies, in a couple of weeks, we will let them free in the gardens nearby. We have a super assortment of books, audio CDs and story sacks to support the children's learning but nothing is exciting as the real thing. We've seen plenty of snails and ladybirds in our garden tubs!

Chaddleshworth St Andrew's and Shefford C.E. Federated Primary Schools



During lunchtime this week, a child came up to me and said "Mrs Stephenson, I used wisdom today because I worked out how to untangle the skipping rope from the hoop and it wasn't easy. But I did it!" She had made the wise choice to keep going, even though it was difficult. A bit later in the week, another child stopped at the door to my office and said "I used wisdom Mrs Stephenson. I wanted to run down the corridor but I stopped myself!" Music to my ears! We have been focusing on our Christian Value of 'Wisdom' this term so that the children understand that being wise is much more than being clever! They know it is about making careful decisions, based on their experiences of the world and weighing up benefits against risks.

The benefits of starting educational trips again were seen in the last couple of weeks as Kingfishers (Y1/Y2) went on a science walk around the village and Robins (EYFS/Y1) went on a welly walk. The Robins had been learning about emails and letters so they posted a letter at the post office in Great Shefford to see what happened next! The Kingfishers were learning how to identify different plants as they walked around the village. While the Kingfishers learnt about identifying plants, Red Kites (Y5/Y6) have been learning the names of the parts of a plant. We make links and connections to previous learning so that the children build on their previous knowledge and understanding.



Owls have been inspired by the Australian Aboriginal art and dreamtime stories that they have been learning about.

Looking ahead, we have a French Week planned, based on healthy eating which the children are learning about in science next term. Our French teacher, Mrs Wilson, is looking forward to teaching all the children how to ask for different fruit and salad items so they can make a fruit smoothie or salad!

Our volunteers have been able to come into school again which is fantastic! Thank you to them for giving up their time – the children love reading and gardening with you!

'Pick up' and 'drop off' have become a test of endurance recently what with the wind and the rain which seem to make a perfectly timed appearance! Looking forward to a slightly drier June! Thank you to everyone for your continued support.

Chaddleworth Parish Council

From **Tuesday 29th June 2021**, Parish Council Meetings will be back to meeting 'face to face' in the Chaddleworth Village Hall. Please do come along to the PC Meetings and air your views

The Parish Council (PC) Members take on a range of duties. We have a Footpath Officer who inspects and reports on the state of footpaths and stiles in the Parish and his findings are reported to the WBC Senior Rights of Way Officer who has the final decision over maintenance.

There is a representative on the Village Hall Committee (VHC) which is a registered Charity enacted in 1945. He reports back to the PC on all the 'goings on' at the Village Hall. Our PC also supports the Village Hall with £900 per year - without which VHC would be at risk of closure.

We also have a representative on the Saunders Wynn and Coventry educational charity set up in 1715 by William Saunders and his wife (who had no children). They are buried in St Andrews Church. Susannah Wynne and Ruth Coventry, left monies to be used to educate the poor children of Chaddleworth. This has helped numerous children of this Parish to attain a good education. The source of income for this used to be the rental of the School House but this was sold off during the nineteen eighties and the money invested to provide funds for the Charity.

The Hardship Fund is administered by Trustees who are members of the Parish Council and is advertised each month in this newsletter. In addition, it is on all the notice boards in the Parish

The PC also looks after the the Play Area (recently improved with new woodwork, wood peelings and infant swings), the football field (along with the Play Area, the rent to the Wroughton estate is covered by the PC) and the Village Hall car park (recently refurbished including a grant by WBC under the 'Members Bid' process courtesy of our District Councillor Clive Hooker who is also the new Chairman of WBC) We also commission Scofell to maintain these areas and the Bus Shelter area.

The PC refurbished the War Memorial and Garden now also including the insertion of an 'Unknown Tommy' at the war memorial in time for VE Day on the 8th May 2021 (the cost of this was £200). The new plants at the Memorial Garden were provided by the generosity of Henry Ponsonby for which we thank him, the rest of the refurbishment was paid for by the village – thank you too.

Finally, we would like to say that if we did not have as good a Clerk as **Kim Lloyd** none of this would be possible. She is exemplary and we are lucky to have her.

Saunders Wynn and Coventry Educational Foundation

Downland Gardening Club

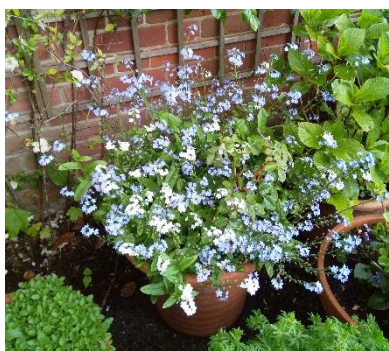
Is it spring, summer or winter I find myself asking, as the temperature plummets, and the rain continues to fall! However our gardens appear to be coping, it seems the plants are loving it and at least we don't have to worry about watering. And the cow parsley is everywhere, so delicate and one of my favourites. Every year I bring it indoors and then regret it because it sheds it's flowers but for a short time it is beautiful. Blue bells in the woods and buttercups everywhere, so there are some plusses.



As I drove to Chichester a few days ago, revelling in the idea of a change of scene and some company I chose to go the "back way." i.e. avoiding the M27 and using the A272. Once this road was the subject of a book

entitled "An Ode to a Road" by a Dutchman who, together with his wife, fell in love with the countryside and villages through which it passes. I think he had a point and at this time of year the colours of the fields and woodlands are particularly good. There is a fantastic avenue of copper beech whose leaves are still that magical orange tone before they mature. Sadly as I went on my way I noticed the devastation that Ash disease is having with large numbers of felled trees. Hinton Ampner (National Trust) is on this road (about 40 miles) well worth a visit – there are fabulous walks around, it has an interesting garden, grounds and a good cafe. There is also a little Saxon church. (not NT).

I notice that, as well as the Rare Plant Fair at Kingston Bagpuise House Sunday 30th May (booking essential) there is a garden in Midgham called "The Dell" open on Monday from 3:00-5:00pm. You do not need to book for this. Established in 1900 by Arthur Sutton, with reputedly 60 gardeners at one time, it fell into disrepair and has been restored over the last 30 years by the present owners. The address is Lindens, Upper Woolhampton RG7 5UA. For Sat Nav use RG7 5UB. Teas being served, owners Tony and Fayleen Billington.



Recipes for the month: Warm Chicken, Lemon and Tarragon Salad for 4

Ingredients: Mixed salad leaves, 4 skinned chicken breasts sliced into strips, 5 rashers streaky bacon, chopped, 1 tsp oil, juice of a lemon, 1 tbsp chopped tarragon, s&p, French dressing.

Heat oil in pan, add chicken and bacon - cook for 4/5 mins. Add lemon juice and chopped tarragon cook for further 4/5 mins. Toss salad with French dressing, add chicken and bacon to dish. Serve with crusty bread.

Cats are really sensitive so always check with your vet before using chemical prevention.

Downland Practice

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update: The current COVID situation is improving with the uptake of the Covid-19 vaccination programme and the recent lockdown procedures beginning to take effect. The surgery is constantly monitoring this issue and will adjust the service according to the severity of the COVID-19 spread of infection. The current situation is being managed as best as we can, all patients must wear a face mask when attending the surgery (unless they are exempt). Updates on the Downland Practice can be found at the practice website news section www.downlandpractice.nhs.uk.

COVID-19 Vaccinations: This vaccination programme will continue from the Newbury Racecourse until the middle of June 2021. The racecourse is mainly concentrating on Covid-19 vaccination second doses. If you have received a vaccine at a mass vaccination centre then they will call you forward for your second dose, to book your vaccination use the following link

Duty Doctor: From the end of April 2021 the Duty Doctor system changed from telephone calls to face to face appointments. Patients who need to be seen on the day by a GP are given a times slot to attend the surgery. Patients may have to wait whilst the Duty Doctor deals with patients who have an urgent clinical need to have action taken. Patients are advised to ring in before 12.00 if they wish to see a GP on the day.

GP Routine Appointments: From June 2021 all GP routine appointments will be offered as face to face appointments. Patients will be sitting in socially distanced waiting area and

when the waiting area is full patients will need to wait outside till there is space available. The check in screens will remain off and all patients checking in to the practice will be undertaken by the receptionist on Duty.

Practice Nurse Appointments: Practice Nurse (PN) clinics have been restructured to allow the PN to run clinics more efficiently, Diabetes / Women's health / Asthma / Dressings and General Nurse clinics are now in place, when patients ring up to book an appointment with the PN, they will be given a time for the appropriate clinic.

Pharmacy Disruption June 2021: The Pharmacy will be undergoing some planned infrastructure work in June 2021. This will involve the Pharmacy moving into a temporary accommodation that will be situated in the surgery car park. It is anticipated that work will take about 6 weeks to be fully complete. We will still be processing medication from the Pharmacy during this planned infrastructure work in June. The temporary pharmacy will arrive around the 28 May 2021 and will be open for business on the 1st June 2021.

There will be two routes available for our wonderful walkers, a 2.5 mile route and a more challenging 6.5 mile route – both of which are circular. During the walk, walkers will cross the River Lambourn, climb the hill to the impressive cricket pitch which overlooks the historic Welford Park, explore the winding woodland paths before crossing the fields and taking in the lovely views of the surrounding countryside.



Every hour, two people are diagnosed with Parkinson's. Because we are here, no one has to face Parkinson's alone. We bring people together via our network of local groups, our website and our free confidential helpline. Specialist nurses, our supporters and staff provide information and training on every aspect of Parkinson's. As the UK's Parkinson's support and research charity we're leading the work to find a cure, and we're closer than ever. We also campaign to change attitudes and to demand better services. 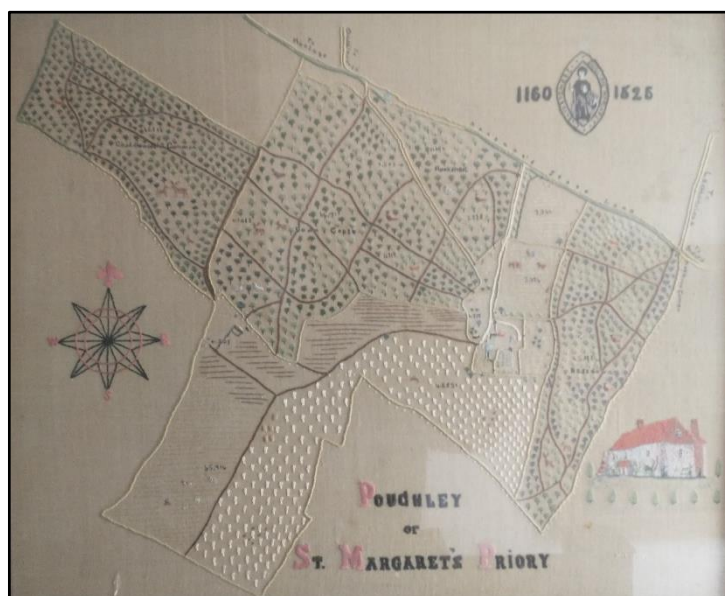
