Henry Ponsonby

With the death of Henry Ponsonby, age 74, Chaddleworth has lost one of its more ebullient characters. He first moved to the village over 30 years ago, renting a cottage in Upper End, where he continued his business of racehorse syndication and then bought Rosemeirion where he lived with his late partner Kish.

He was a pioneer of racehorse syndicates and for over four decades had many big race successes with over 450 winners on

the Flat and National Hunt, including at the big festivals of Cheltenham, Aintree, Royal Ascot, York, Glorious Goodwood etc. He was proud to have had runners in the Grand National and the Derby.

He excelled in selling shares in his horses and many owners came from all walks of life, including novelist Jilly Cooper and former Manchester United manager Sir Alex Ferguson, many of whom visited him at his house in Chaddleworth.

One of his favourite horses in recent times he named *Who Dares Wins* and it was assumed by many of his owners, but not his amused friends, that he had been in the SAS in his military days. Oddly, he never quite got around to denying this rumour.

Henry was the eternal optimist, nothing got him down. He was a loyal friend to many, a great raconteur and good company. He enjoyed living in the village and contributed to many local causes, including the beautiful newly formed war memorial garden next to his house. Never afraid to express his views and opinions, he could be a scourge of the Parish Council if things were awry.

He would often be seen out walking with his black Labrador, Miller, or dropping in to the Ibex Inn and engaging with anyone for an interesting conversation.

Henry is survived by his daughter, Christine, his ex-wife Jane, his dog Miller and assorted racehorses that will continue to run in his memory – the best of which may prove to be *Boy Browning*.

Downland Gardening Club

How are we gardeners meant to know what season of the year it is? The sun shines, it is really warm and then a sudden change, pelting rain and high winds and we can tell that we need to think of frosts and, oh dear. have I even ordered my bulbs? The answer to this is yes, after my normal happy browsing of nursery websites catalogues I find myself reordering my favourites. Ballerina, National Velvet and Spring Green – but I have also succumbed to one new tulip Flaming Purissima and a little narcissus called Sailboat. Perhaps this weekend is tulip planting in my pots and a visit to the Garden Centre to decide what I will plant as cover. Just an excuse for a visit to Yew Tree.



The sweel chestnuts have been raining on my roof, there has been a fantastic Apple and Plum Harvest but, I understand, few Pears. Lots of Blackberries to add to the Apples and those with Fig and Quince Trees went looking for new recipes. On a recent visit to Kent at a fabulous National Trust Property, *Smallhythe*, (well worth a visit if you are near Rye) which was the home of Ellen Terry, and still has and uses the Barn

Theatre where she trod the boards, among an orchard of Kentish Apples there was a medlar tree absolutely covered in ripening medlars. I am waiting for the blackbirds to strip my crab apple tree but so far they are obviously too well fed elsewhere. Sadly, at Oak Ash we have had the noise of tree felling recently as the decision was made that the diseased Ash Trees had to be culled. This reminds me of my arrival in Berkshire in the 70s when I kept asking 'where are the trees'. I came from Sussex. the Ashdown Forest was my back garden and that is Oak country. Berkshire was Elm country and had suffered from the terrible devastation of Dutch Flm Disease. Travelling from here to Sussex now, the new devastation of Ash Dieback is obvious and a tragedy.

Cuttings, cuttings, don't forget now is the time for your Salvias, Penstemons, Geraniums, Lavender, Lemon Verbena (lovely to flavour ice cream) and others. Monty Don showed us how, as well as dividing herbaceous plants. Do you have a helpful puppy? Enjoy the sun while it lasts, happy leaf gathering, and possibly the last mow of the season. *Judy Kelley*

Collections from flats and communal dwellings begin 28 November 2022

Your new separate weekly food waste collections start from **Monday 31**st **October 2022.** We are making these changes to the way your food waste is collected so that it is collected weekly using a smaller, more secure container to encourage everyone to recycle food waste for a greener West Berkshire.

Collection will take place on the same day as your black bin and recycling collections. You will be able to recycle the same types of food waste as our current food waste collection service including: meat and fish; fruit and vegetables; cheese and eggs; bread and pastries; uneaten food from plates; tea bags and coffee grounds.

Please **do not** put bones from red meat, oils, liquids or fats into your caddy. Please do not put any packaging such as plastic wrapping in the food waste bin.

<u>Blind Spot</u>: The PC have been told by West Berks Council Highways that we would not be allowed to erect a convex mirror at the junction of School Hill and Main Street. We are disappointed that our request has been refused as we had sought and gained the permission of the landowner.

20 mile per hour speed limit: Following our request for this in the village, we have been informed that Kintbury do have such a limit.

Norris Lane: The Parish Council are now pursuing the final avenue to prove to Sovereign that they need to accept their responsibility for the footpath and parking area. They have used their usual tactic of obfuscation and denial. This is on-going and the PC has sent photo's to demonstrate the situation and enlisted the help of our MP. WBC Boundaries Officer has now been in touch with the PC but so far we have not had a further response.

<u>Right to Buy</u>: We are pursuing this with Sovereign and our MP Laura Farris. There are a number of tenants that would like to buy their homes and we will do our very best to help them.






