#### **Chaddleworth Christmas Sale**

Our Christmas Sale at the Village Hall raised £369.60 to be shared between two charities.

Firstly, *The Abel Foundation*: Claire and Tony set up the Foundation after their son, Abel, was diagnosed with Mitochondrial disease. As the doctors knew little about this disease, they resorted to the internet to research how they could help their son. The Foundation was set up in 2015 to help provide support for sufferers and the families of this disease.

Secondly, *The Newbury Soup Kitchen*. This is a voluntary organisation providing help and support to the Newbury homeless community and to those less fortunate than others. Founded and managed by *Meryl Praill* with the support of *Andrew Williams*, the primary operation is a friendly dropin centre for vulnerable adults who perhaps have mental health issues or are just lonely. All are greeted with hot food and drinks every Thursday evening. A warm welcome awaits people who wish to socialise, find support, enjoy a hot meal and interact with line-minded people.

Glen Bourne organised this event with the help of her son, Liam. She would like to thank Diane and Hazel for organising the teas and cakes, Phyllis, John and their granddaughter, Anya, for running the Tombola stall and selling cakes, Heather and Grahame for helping out where necessary, also thanks to the other three stall holders. Lastly, thank you to all those who made cakes and everyone who came along to support this event.

# **Downland Gardening Club**

As I write this, I realise that another year has almost past, it is dark, the curtains are drawn and I am lucky as there is a lovely open fire to keep me warm. We have certainly had some strange weather to contend with during this month and year and it seems very possible that this will continue, and may well change our gardening practices and perhaps the plants we grow. Time will tell, but certainly looking back to this year's Flower Show, the nurseries Chelsea experienced great difficulties in having their plants ready at the right time because of the weather. I am also very aware of this at the moment as I need to plant up the large pots, either side of my front door, for the winter

and spring but the central plant in each pot, salvia leucantha is still bursting with bloom and beautiful. However, one day next week is moving day to a sheltered spot and the tulips will get planted.

Now is the time to enjoy house plants and I confess to falling for some mini cyclamen this week. The offer at Hillier's was too tempting, and four little pots are brightening my house.

Thoughts turn to making Christmas wreaths, and the need to pick Holly before the birds strip the trees. Do check out the National Trust's site for things to see and do at this time of year. They have a full programme of events.

#### Recipe of the month: Apple and Parsnip Soup

25grm butter, 1 tbsp. oil, 2 onions, 600grms parsnips and 600 grms cooking apples, peeled and chopped. 2 garlic cloves, crushed, 1 litre chicken or vegetable stock, 150ml milk, salt and pepper.

Gently fry onions and parsnips until onions are soft, add garlic, apples for 2 mins stirring regularly. Add soft, about 20 mins, Blend. stir in milk, add more if

stock, simmer until parsnips necessary, check seasoning. Serve with crusty bread and cheeses.

If you are a crumble fan have you tried adding raspberries to apples or to pears? Also topping apples with mincemeat in a tart?



<u>Autumn Flu and Covid-19 Clinics</u>: The Autumn Flu and Covid-19 vaccination uptake has been exceptional. Thank you for your support, these also provide much needed income for the surgery.

With the ever-worsening economic situation in the UK, we want to **thank you all** for your continued support. Running a pub isn't easy in these times, but we are so happy to be a place to go for the good times and bad.

Our current energy contract runs out next month, and our new quote is 78.6p per kph (up from 16.8p per kph for the past year). Although we are looking at alternatives this seems to be the going rate which is why some pubs are choosing to close for winter. Our green energy project is ongoing but we are experiencing delays due to supplier issues.

We are partnered with Heineken who have vast knowledge in this industry, but have also increased their prices three times over the past year with another increase expected in January. On average, the cost of a pint should have gone up between 40-60p, however we are absorbing as much of the cost as we can so only a small percentage is passed onto our customers.

We are so grateful for all that support us. We love to host the village events such as *The Seniors Christmas Lunch* coming up this month, *the Harvest Auction* and *Terrier Race*. Over the time we have been open we have raised 100s of pounds for charities such as Trindledown, Air Ambulance and others. 
