### **Chaddleworth Parish Council**

The big news from Chaddleworth PC this month is that we have reduced next year's precept. This is the portion of council tax which goes towards the village.

In 2022-23 folk in a band-D household were paying £8.63 a month. From 1<sup>st</sup> April this year a band D household will pay £6.55 a month, a reduction of nearly 25%. This reduction has been fully costed and has been made possible after a few years of astute and prudent leadership of the PC under the previous chairman.

The other news is that we have co-opted two new members, **Mr. Alex Woodroffe** and **Mr. Graham Stanley**. Thank you to them both for joining the PC. This means that we are nearly back to full strength. We also have a new clerk starting in early March. *Jim Wilson*

### Local car sharing initiative coming soon!

Are you often travelling alone and wondering how inefficient it is when others are probably doing similar journeys? Or are you sometimes needing to be somewhere and just don't have the means to get there and could do with a lift? A pilot of a car sharing initiative is being launched soon in the local area and you are invited to find out more and give it a go by signing up for FREE! Maybe your New Year's resolutions have not quite worked out but you'd still like to try something new in 2023 ... this could be for you. And there is the added bonus of doing something positive for the community, the environment and your bank balance too!

Sharing journeys using the 'Liftshare' scheme is flexible and you only share with people who you choose to connect with – you remain in complete control. Only residents with West Berkshire postcodes can sign up to the group so it is very much a local initiative which is hoped will give people confidence to try it out.

For the initiative to work, those who are happy to share their journey need to sign up as well as those who would benefit from receiving a lift – otherwise the matching up doesn't happen!

There are ways of ensuring the costs of travel are shared and as you log your journeys the system will work out collectively how we are helping to reduce the negative impacts on our planet. Obviously, it is even better if you are travelling in an electric car!

The journeys you choose to share could be a trip to a local centre for shopping, going to church or accessing various other facilities. It could be to attend a popular event or a sports fixture or it could be for work purposes. It is up to you.



### West Berkshire Council Local Elections 2023

Local District and Parish elections are upcoming **Thursday 4**th **May 2023** 

Make sure you have registered to vote by **Monday 17**<sup>th</sup> **April**. You can do this at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote

And don't forget that for the first time, you need to bring ID with you as well.



Since elections were last held in May 2019, the UK Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when

voting at a polling station at some elections. This new requirement will apply for the first time in England at the May local elections.

Acceptable forms of ID include:


- ✓ Passport
- ✓ Driving licence (including provisional license)
- ✓ Blue badge
- ✓ Certain concessionary travel cards
- Identity card with PASS mark (Proof of Age Standards Scheme)
- ✓ Biometric Immigration document
- ✓ Defence identity card
- ✓ Certain national identity cards

Voters will be able to use expired ID if they are still recognisable from the photo.


