#### **Christine Elizabeth Patterson**

25th December 1928 to 22nd January 2023



Countless joyful memories

When I look back over her life, I can only think of the countless joyful moments that I shared with her

Her love of cricket! Inherited from her Worcestershire supporting father. Me with her at the Scarborough Festival each year when we lived in Yorkshire and then at Edgebaston when in Warwickshire, endless days of cricket!

Her sense of adventure! Firstly, going to live in India in the 1950s and exploring that country; then, frequent visits to us in Hong Kong and China continued that adventure; South America and many other places followed.

The Isles of Scilly! Many a holiday my parents had there. She used to rave about the Gigg races. Then for her 90th birthday Sally and I took her there and together we retraced their footsteps.

Treacle sponge and custard! I'll never forget those last Fridays of the school holidays when my favourite pudding was served for lunch. None has ever made it as good as she did! Yes, I was spoilt!

Then there are the snowdrops that line our drive in Farnham and also her in Chaddleworth garden – in abundance now! She would give me a new box of bulbs each year to plant in my garden and how they have multiplied!

That joyful last month of her life over Xmas which she spent with us all, Sally and I, her three grandchildren Camilla, Jonathan and Emily, and her newly arrived great granddaughter Eliza. Before Xmas at Emily's wedding, I shall never forget her dancing with me that night to a very lively band!

#### What kind of woman was Christine

Reading the many letters and cards of condolence that have been sent by family and friends; searching through old photos, a picture emerges of the qualities that framed my Mother. A caring nature, a good listener, interested in talking to people of all ages, a dear friend and neighbour, devoted to her family, always willing to help, a great sense of community and devotion to village life.

These virtues all come out in the messages I have received...

"Christine was a very special person and we feel lucky to have been her neighbour for many years".

"She was someone who was always interested in you, your family and what you did".

"With Neville [my father], she gave a huge amount of time and energy to many aspects of village life – the Church, the School, the Gardening and Cricket Clubs; Mothers and Toddlers and the Parish Council".



Her Life

She was born on Xmas Day 1928 with her twin brother, Noel. They were 2 of 4 children born to a couple still suffering the scars of the FWW – her father had been wounded and taken prisoner

and those wounds and the privations of his captivity would live with him for the rest of his life. There were regular night-time visits from the doctor. My Mother would tell how she would lie awake those nights praying her father would still be alive in the morning.

As a child she developed asthma and this stayed with her for the rest of her life. Forever using an inhaler, it was this that saw her voice becoming ever more frail. Her asthma severely compromised her love of music but if her ability to sing was limited she took immense pleasure from playing the piano.

These events in turn made her mentally tough. But aged 18 she enrolled at the Radcliffe Infirmary in Oxford to train as a nurse, as had been her own mother. She told me that had always wanted to be a doctor and that this was a possible career but somewhere this door was closed. Who knows, but I believe she would have made an excellent GP.

But fortune came her way in Oxford for there she met my father, a student and, like her own father, recently demobilised from war service. There at Oxford began a loving relationship which in 1950 became a marriage which was to last 59 years.

What a life they had together. A devoted couple, happy and caring. They formed an enviable family unit and I don't ever recall any real tension or argument between them. My own upbringing was a contented and untroubled one protected by the firm bond that they had formed. In a world witnessing the gradual erosion of family and marital values, their marriage was a model for me and others to emulate.

Soon after marrying and a brief time in London, they set off by boat to Calcutta – it was before the days of regular air travel - for a 4-year adventure in India. My Mother had ceased nursing after I was born but in Calcutta she met and became a follower of Mother Theresa and gave time helping her Missionaries of Charity. My Mother's sense of community and her willingness to help others comes in part from her own upbringing but also from the impression Mother Theresa made on her. She kept a copy of Mother Theresa's book – "The Best Gift is Love" - by her side for the rest of her life.

Returning to England her communal activities continued. I well remember accompanying her on her Meals on Wheels rounds in Saltburn when we lived on the North East Coast and the pleasure I saw it gave to the elderly and poor on receiving those hot meals.

And so to Chaddleworth just over 40 years ago. Many here today will know better than I the contribution she (together with my father) made to the life of the community in

Chaddleworth. I have already mentioned some of these here – the village school, the Church, Gardening Club are but a continuation of her sense of community, her willingness to help others while at the same time making new friends, friendships that she would tell me about and treasure. I myself have fond memories of Chaddleworth Garden Open Days, our many walks up the long drive to Oak Ash Farm, our lunches in the pubs in the area but none better than lunch at the Ibex! But the one constant throughout her life was her love of the garden and of flowers. Every house we lived in, it was the garden that received her fullest attention. Rudyard Kipling's "The Glory of the Garden" which Sonia will read is a tribute to this love of hers.

#### Finally

A life well lived and full of happiness, family and faith. That she should live independently in her own home till the end and not suffer knowingly is something that we can perhaps envy. That she was seen driving her car round the village 2 days before her stroke is perhaps not!

Sadly, she lived the last 13 years of her life alone without the man she met all those years before in Oxford. That he was always there in her heart and in her mind there can be no doubt. And now she can join him once more, together again at last in a new life. Of that we can all be thankful

#### **Downland Gardening Club**

I do not think I can remember a time of such changeable weather. The sun shines brightly and we all think 'great', don our boots and gardening coat and sally forth into the garden, secateurs, trowel or fork in hand to finish pruning the roses or any task that is a priority... only to be greeted moments later by lashing rain, sleet or even snow.



But we persevere as gardeners and now my roses (and I hope yours) are pruned and shooting, cuttings are growing and



seeds sown indoors are germinating. Now the pleasure ahead is choosing some new pelargoniums and a climbing rose. A nursery or garden centre visit is called for.

This morning I drove to Compton across the Downs on a brilliant sunny morning, passing sheep with their lambs and hedges full of white Blackthorn, Catkins and verges awash with Daffodils. The occasional pink Prunus in gardens, brilliant yellow Forsythia and even a Camellia, and more Daffodils. It made up for all the rain. Although I am so aware it is needed by the farmers and fruit and vegetable growers.

#### **Sky Notes for April**

After the March 20<sup>th</sup> equinox, when days became longer than nights and with the double whammy of summer time starting on March 26<sup>th</sup>, the skies only get reasonably dark by 9pm at the start of April and by 10pm at the end of the month.

The planet **Venus** is now well placed in the west all evening, much brighter than the brightest stars and visible even in strong twilight. For a few days either side of April 10<sup>th</sup> it passes the beautiful star cluster called the **Pleiades** or Seven Sisters, close enough to be in the same binocular field of view. When close to another object like this its motion against the fixed background stars is obvious from night to night, as it was at the beginning of March when it passed close by **Jupiter**.

The three pictures here, taken with a camera-phone over 9 days show Venus moving swiftly upwards past Jupiter which, also being a planet is not actually in a fixed place, but was moving much more slowly in the opposite direction.

Mars is also well placed in the evening sky in the constellation of **Gemini** but is now more distant from Earth than it was when at its best back in December. It is about 15 times fainter now and is a similar brightness to nearby bright stars, making it more difficult to pick out, but a paper star chart, or a star chart app on a phone or tablet will easily reveal which one it is.

And don't forget that for the first time, you need to bring ID with you as well.



Since elections were last held in May 2019, the UK Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when

voting at a polling station at some elections. This new requirement will apply for the first time in England at the May local elections.

Acceptable forms of ID include:

- ✓ Passport
- Driving licence (including provisional license)
- ✓ Blue badge
- ✓ Certain concessionary travel cards
- Identity card with PASS mark (Proof of Age Standards Scheme)
- ✓ Biometric Immigration document
- ✓ Defence identity card
- ✓ Certain national identity cards


