

### Finding a new Rector

The interregnum in which we find ourselves is another new journey and to make it successful, like all journeys, we need to apply the principal elements of navigation: first among which is to know where we are and second is to know where we are going. We are not alone on Earth in this situation. The gaggle of Pink-foot geese, that battle the winds and the rain of the North Sea twice a year, do this guided by an inherent, Godgiven system that we do not possess. A camel-train crossing the Sahara is much the same. All us travellers know that we want to arrive safely at the destination but we, unlike the natural traveller, need help.

Perhaps in the West Downland Benefice we are most like a convoy of eight ships. Each ship, our church, is different. Some are more seaworthy than others. Each one has different engine power. All of them have magnetic compasses and charts and each of them has its own captain and crew: the churchwarden and the PCC. It is their duty to work the ship. There is cooking and cleaning to be done, a Log to be kept, positions to be fixed, anticollision radar to be manned, the water maker maintained and so on.

The captain and crew can read the compass, receive the weather forecast, check the chart for rocks and sandbanks and pinpoint the light houses along the way. They also need to fill the ship with passengers who will journey with us and share the cost of the food and fuel. Amongst them there are babies to be born, children to be taught, lost passengers to be comforted and ill passengers to be cared for. There are young passengers to be married and there are passengers to be buried.

What the crew needs is a convoy master – the new incumbent – that can, with Jesus's

help, determine our shared destination and can teach us how to work God's GPS satellite guidance system, thus leading the United Benefice convoy between the channel markers to the Fairway Buoy of the Promised Harbour.

The geese in the North Sea, the camels in the Sahara, hatchling turtles travelling through the sand to the sea, swallows now arriving from Africa are like us. Some journey alone, some like the geese do it together but we are all individuals. We were born with moral compasses, but not necessarily do we have the skill to read them. God has given natural ability to the animals, but we humans are forced to make the choices for ourselves. We are lucky to have the charts and instruction manuals inherited over millennia from the Church and we are not alone. God and Jesus, his son help us understand and his angels and the clergy are there to guide us through the shipping lanes, which exist for our safety.

We are looking for someone to maintain the cohesion of the convoy, our little armada on its way to the Promised Land.

In Chaddleworth, we have St Andrew's church with Captain and a little crew. It is a beautiful ship, sailing today through the sea of new, green wheat and barley, warmed by late spring sunshine, and watered by the welcome rain. Actual passengers are few, but the potential ones are many. The late Queen's Jubilee, her funeral and the King's coronation have brought the passengers together, and there is a much stronger cohesion amongst them than there was a few years ago so the opportunity for the Parish Council and the Rector to cast its net into this pool of passengers is better than ever

St Andrew was a fisher of men.

It was a great day out for all the family.








