HEROS Charity opened its doors on Wednesday 13th September as part of the National Racehorse Week which is now in its 3rd year. HEROS had a great turn out of about 80 visitors who were shown round the rehoming centre and the HEROS education unit which helps children that are unable to thrive in the general education system.

In an introduction by Grace Muir (CEO) the visitors learnt about the development of HEROS at North Farm Stud over the past 17 years and about future aspirations as HEROS is just about to start a Forest School. The visitors then had a tour seeing some horses being ridden, a farrier demonstration. chiropractic а demonstration and a demonstration on an equcizer by a local jockey under the tuition of John Reid a former Derby winning jockey. The visitors met lots of the horses and also learnt about support by the public by joining the HEROS Club. This supports the horses that will stay at HEROS due to age or problems that would make it difficult for a potential lessee to take on. The Downland Practice

<u>NHS app</u>: The Downland Practice is now using the NHS app to send patient messages. Patients with the NHS app downloaded and their notifications switched on will automatically receive text messages from the practice as app notifications. Downloading the NHS app and switching notifications on is optional. If you do not wish to switch this on, we will continue to contact you by phone, text, and letter as usual.

GP Locum: Dr Curtis will be working at the Downland Practice from 12th January 2023 as a Locum GP. He will be seeing patients from all of the Surgery GP lists in an aim to reduce patients waiting times. This is a NHS funded post and is short term only.

<u>Care Coordinator</u>. Our Care Coordinators are trained to signpost patients to appropriate care and are now responsible for coordinating reviews for patients with chronic health conditions. We are pleased to say that our recent patient survey results showed that 66% of our patients found it easy to get through to us by telephone (this is higher than the national average of 50%) and we are also thrilled to say that 85% (compared to the national average of 82%) of patients found our Care Coordination Team helpful. This is also up from last year when the figure was 73%.

<u>Pharmacy Services</u>: Our pharmacy is a very valuable community resource that has been under increasing pressure over recent months. Due to pharmacy closures in Newbury and the surrounding area, our pharmacy is under increasing strain. To help with demand, please allow 5 working days for your repeat prescription. Pharmacy calls are being transferred to our Care Coordinators who, if they cannot help, will pass your details and query to the pharmacy team. If you need medical advice, a pharmacist is sometimes more appropriate to deal with your problem than a GP or nurse.

Highway Code Reminder



An update to The Highway Code introduces a hierarchy of road users. The Department for Transport claims that the changes, which are split into three main rules, ultimately aim to improve safety for pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders. The changes came into force on **29**th **January**.

AK

Give cyclists, horse riders and pedestrians as much room as a car – 1.5 metres for cyclists and 2 metres for horses.

Drive under 10mph when going past horses and under 30mph when passing cyclists. Give at least 2 metres berth when passing




pedestrians walking on the road where there is no pavement and make

is no pavement and make sure that your speed is low.

How has The Highway Code changed?

- Drivers of large passenger vehicles and HGVs now have 'the greatest responsibility to reduce the danger posed to other road users'
- Drivers at a junction should give way to pedestrians crossing or waiting to cross a road that they're turning into
- Drivers should not cut across cyclists going ahead when turning into or out of a junction or changing direction or lane
- New 'Dutch Reach' technique tells road users how to open the door of their vehicle while looking over their shoulder.

12th September Meeting Summary

<u>Planning Applications Received</u>: It was noted that West Berkshire Council has received a section 31(6) Highways Act 1980 statement and map from the owner of Ibex Field, Chaddleworth which has also been display on the village notice boards.

The council discussed a 'neighbourhood plan' and whether they should undertake a project to create a fresh on for Chaddleworth Parish. This would require a small parish working group as was done some years ago also.

Would you volunteer to support this? If you have planning, canvasing or legal experience then this would be of special value. Please contact the Clerk.

<u>Village Entrance Gates and Roadside Maintenance</u>: It was noted with thanks that the hedge at the junction with School Hill has been cut back. It was also noted that the hedge of Rosemeirion has become overgrown whilst the property is for-sale. It is understood that this will be attended to following the completion of the sale which is expected shortly.

The Council discussed using a local service to address needed roadside maintenance without being frustrated by the lack of response by WBC and others.

Would you quote and provide ad-hoc maintenance services to Chaddleworth Parish Council when needed? Please contact the Clerk.

The Council further agreed that the five Village speed-awareness white entrance gates should be repaired or replaced with long-lasting wood such as oak (not with plastic) and so that the subsequent maintenance needed is minimal.

Local Flooding: Cllr. J Wilson has met with the field owner adjacent to Mount Lane who is very supportive. It was noted that this grip is now open and that, on 5th August after heavy rain, was working well. That there is often some flooding on School Hill towards Leckhampstead Thicket was noted and that, if this reoccurs, the landowner may be notified to attend to the grips here. It was also noted that there is an ongoing water leak here which has been advised to Thames Water. (Ed. Subsequently fixed)

<u>Councillors' Reports</u>: It was noted that the parish grit bins will need filing before the winter.

On behalf of the parish, Cllr. J Wilson attended the Connecting Communities in Berkshire (CCB) Warm and Welcoming Spaces forum. It was also noted that CCB are holding an Everyday First Aid event in Chaddleworth Village Hall on 21st September.

<u>Clerk Reports</u>: The Clerk reported that the defibrillator was temporarily removed from service whilst being updated. The Council discussed and unanimously agreed that a 2nd defibrillator might be purchased and be located at Chaddleworth Village Hall.

The clerk reported that letters for overgrown footpaths in the parish had been sent and satisfactory responses received.

The Clerk reported having hosted the West Berkshire Clerks' forum meeting, attended the Citizens Advice West Berkshire AGM and attended and emailed WBC 'Meet the Contractor Event' about bin emptying.

D-Day 80th events scheduled 6th June 2024 were discussed and Cllr. K Brady knows a list of planned events over 5 days (Beacon, Cricket Club event, Fete, Ibex Inn swing band). RAF Welford is involved in communication and it is envisaged to seek a display from the RAF Welford Historical Society in Chaddleworth Village Hall.

<u>Council</u>: There was no meeting of Council this month. The next meeting is on 5th October. <u>Executive</u>: There was no meeting of the Executive this month. The next meeting is on 21st September. <u>100 Day Plan</u>: 100 Days have passed since the Liberal Democrats won the election. Their 100 Day Plan has been reviewed with a report available online at wbca.org.uk/100DayReview

<u>Leisure</u>: Northcroft Lido is now officially open. The new facility includes water slides, a splash pad and an Olympic sized 50 metre swimming pool, to entertain children and adults alike.

Please follow the instructions you will have received to confirm your details as soon as possible, including addition of any 16- or 17-year-olds in the household. If you need to, you can also contact the Council directly on 01635 519464. Any new electors can register to vote on the **gov.uk** website.

<u>Council Finances</u>: An action plan to reduce spending this year has been put in place as the Council continues to be affected by rising inflation, increasing customer demand and a challenging job market. Spending reductions will be focused on internal measures with frontline services remaining available to the public and future spending prioritised towards supporting our most vulnerable residents.


Recycling and Environment: WBC are increasing the number of appointments at the Household Waste Recycling Centres

(HWRCs) across the district in order to improve the service for all.



<u>Public Protection</u>: WBC's Early Response Hub hosted a workshop for young people last month that gave them important information about staying safe online. A fraudulent builder from Swindon who left work unfinished after pressuring victims to pay more than the agreed price was last month sentenced at Reading Crown Court.

<u>Culture</u>: An exhibition of new paintings and ceramics by artist Robert Fitzmaurice is open since 27th September in Gallery 5 at West Berkshire Museum. The exhibition takes inspiration from local history, especially that of Newbury wharf in its 300th year. Robert will be providing a free public talk at the Museum on Wednesday 18th October 2023 and he will be delivering a free creative workshop that explores local history.
