

Chaddleworth Parish Council meets every other month with the next meeting on Tuesday 9th January 2024 at 7:30pm in Chaddleworth Village Hall. All welcome.

At our last meeting we resolved to improve the white 'speed awareness' gates at the road entryways to Chaddleworth – the four that already have them and to install an additional white gate on Spray Lane. We hope to have the work carried out in the near future. These gates highlight the entrances to the village and, by being brightened up, they will hopefully help to reinforce the 30mph speed limit within the village.

An email has been sent to Sovereign Housing, copied to Cllr. Clive Hooker (Downland's District Councillor), Laura Farris MP and Newbury Weekly News, asking for an explanation for their proposed sale of one of their properties in Longrow. No response has been received at the time of writing. The Parish Council is disappointment at not being consulted before this sale. We hold a register

of parish applicants for affordable housing and are sure there would have been an applicant for this property. Anyone wishing to be added to our register please contact The Parish Clerk by email at **chaddleworth.pc@outlook.com**

The eight local salt bins have been inspected and one, at the bottom of School Hill, has been found to need replacing. We will also be providing a scoop for each one to assist folk with spreading salt when required.

A second defibrillator has been purchased and will be installed at Chaddleworth Village Hall within a few weeks. This is in addition to the defibrillator already in the Phone Box adjacent to The Ibex Inn and both registered with 'The Circuit', the UK Gov standard for registration of defibrillators so that they are used when needed

Thank you to **John Ballard** for kindly laying a poppy wreath at RAF Welford this year. Chaddleworth lays two wreaths every year, one at our village's war memorial and one at the base. It was lovely to see all the folk who turned out on Remembrance Sunday this year and a big thank you to **Mike Hedges-Jackson and Kathy Howells** for the much-needed warming drinks. Thanks also to Cllr. Shane McAllister-Lovelock for his fine exhortation to end the two-minute silence.

We would like to start work on a neighbourhood plan, anyone interested in shaping the future of our beautiful parish, please come forward. Young and not so young residents most welcome. Please contact The Parish Clerk by email if you would like to contribute your ideas.

Lastly, we would like to wish **Nathan de Souza** well upon his leaving The Ibex Inn and to thank him sincerely for the work he has done, along with Gavin Rees, to reinvigorate our pub.

The Downland Practice

NHS app: The NHS currently spends a huge amount on text messages sent to patients so to help this, the NHS app messaging feature has been introduced. Patients with the NHS app downloaded and their notifications switched on will automatically receive text messages from the practice as app notifications instead. Downloading the NHS app and switching notifications on is optional. If you do not wish to switch this on, we will continue to contact you by phone, text, and letter as usual. Flu and Covid Clinics 2023: The Downland Team delivered an excellent flu and covid service this year, we did have a slight hiccup during the first afternoon session, but this was soon resolved. Thank you to all patients who booked in with the surgery to have your flu and Covid-19 vaccinations. Unclear on what the government will be offering in terms of Covid-19 vaccinations next year, but the surgery has already ordered the flu vaccines for September 2024. We will reduce the numbers of under 65's flu vaccinations that we will offer next year as this group did not attend as well as the over 65 group.

Compton Dispensary: The Compton Dispensary has had its refit completed (Still a few snagging jobs to do), this will future proof this facility for years to come. Sorry for any inconvenience this may have caused our patients whilst this work was carried out

<u>Medication deliveries</u>: The Downland Practice do weekly drop offs of medications to some of the local villages. For this to occur, someone from the village needs to sign up to be the receiver of the medication and hold this until collected by the patient. All medications are in sealed bags and only the name of the patient is available. No

Controlled Medication or fridge items can be sent using this system. Patients can request to use this service by contacting the Downland Pharmacy on **pharmacy.downland@nhs.net**, this will require filling out a form that you are happy for your medication to be delivered to your local drop off point.

A drop off point is NOT CURRENTLY AVAILABLE in Chaddleworth.

NHS feedback: The last few months has seen the patient feedback via the NHS website increase. A link to our reviews page and Friends and Family Survey is sent out to patients with mobile numbers after their appointments. We see all responses and aim to respond to each in a timely manner. Movement out of Practice Boundary Area: We get many requests for patients to stay with the Downland Practice when they move out of the practice boundary area. If you do move out of the practice boundary area, be aware that you can request to stay with the downland Practice, but this is very seldom granted. Please, if you are moving out of the area, do arrange to ensure you have enough medication to last whilst your new GP Practice process your application.

<u>Downland Volunteer Group (DVG)</u>: The DVG are very close to receiving their new Electric Minibus, this will be located at the Downland Practice Chieveley. The History Bit

In this edition I am covering St Andrews Church. Books have been written about it so I am covering the subject very scantily as it would be too onerous to try to cover it in one edition.

Records at the Berkshire Record Office indicate that there has been a Saxon place of worship on this site since the ninth century so 800 and something, so it is very ancient.

You probably all know that King Alfred was born in Wantage, some 7.5 miles away, and the Saxon Court was there. There are no Saxon vestiges in the church but it has been plastered inside and out so what may lie beneath this? After all an ancient Saxon window was uncovered at Boxford during renovations and is now on show.

An interesting feature of St Andrews is the Ordnance Survey 'benchmark' (an arrow head) on the wall to the left of the porch door this was an 'elevation' mark to signify the height above sea level that church is at.

Moving on to Henry the VIII, he granted the Manor of Wooley to Richard Tate in

1540 and St Andrews was referred to as 'Wooley Abbey'. Not long after this it was sold it to Mr John Read who then sold it to Mr Thomas Tipping and his son Bartholomew. The church had fallen into disrepair but one of the three Tippings all called Bartholomew had the church refurbished. It is surmised that some records of this may be found in the Woolley Estate Court Rolls and deeds at Woolley Park? Another source for details would be the Church Register Chest as I have seen mention made of it in 1925.

It is very difficult to penetrate the 'darkness' of early history but some 'glimmers' are there. For instance, Chaddleworth and its Church were recorded in the Domesday Book that William the Conqueror had published so that he could assess exactly the wealth of the lands he had conquered. Chaddleworth and its Church were recorded in 1086 and there is a plaque to this event in the Church porch placed by the Parish Council back in the early 1980's.

Back in 1925 Chaddleworth was paired with Woolley and a book I have read refers the Church History Chaddleworth-cum-Woolley. Woolley, in medieval times, was also known as Wulvney. However. back 1160 in Chaddleworth St Andrews was given by Ralph Basset (also known as Ralph de Chaddleworth) to the newly founded Priory of Poughley (now named St Margarets Priory) which now lies within RAF Welford.



There is quite a bit of confusion over whether St Andrews has a Rector or a Vicar. When consulting the Oxford English Dictionary, it seems that if the tithe (one tenth of the produce from the Parish used to support the Church) passes to an incumbent rather that an organisation it would be a Rector. Whereas if the tithe passes to a chapter or religious house or even a layman then it would be a Vicar. Very confusing!

In the 1752 St Andrews Church accounts book there are two interesting inclusions: whipping dogs and washing. Whipping dogs were long sticks for 'tapping' badly behaved children in the church by men sitting behind and the washing referred to was the washing of the Parsons surplice and the altar fair cloth.

From the records, the church has changed quite a bit from what is apparent now and at its western end there was a large gallery right up to and over the main entrance covering a window on the north side and extending over the font. It was approached by a spiral staircase from inside the belfry. On the front covering the whole was painted/carved the particulars of the Parish Charities This can still be seen albeit in an elevated position. Some reports claim that the gallery could seat 100 persons!

North Wessex Downs National Landscape

From Wednesday 22nd November, all designated Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONBs) in England and Wales are becoming National Landscapes. The name reflects their national new importance; the vital contribution they make to protect the nation from the threats of climate change. nature depletion and the wellbeing crisis, whilst also creating greater understanding and awareness of the work that they do.

This is an exciting next step for *the North Wessex Downs*, and for the UK, in fully realising the National Landscapes' vision to be the leading exemplars of how thriving, diverse communities can work with and for nature in the UK: restoring ecosystems, providing food, storing carbon to mitigate the effects of climate change, safeguarding against drought and flooding, whilst also nurturing people's health and wellbeing.

Our new logo features the Uffington White Horse — the best-known landscape feature of the North Wessex Downs — and one of eight white horses that sit within the designated landscape. Blue represents the big skies that can be experienced up on the chalk downs and are such a significant part of the natural beauty of the landscape.

Henry Oliver, Director of North Wessex Downs National Landscape says:

"Third-largest of the UK's National Landscapes, the North Wessex Downs has it all: from characterful villages and sparkling chalk streams, through farmland wildlife and ancient woodland to the high chalk downs. Perhaps most special of all is the sheer richness of ancient monuments and landscapes that still survive, thousands of years after they were shaped by our prehistoric ancestors.

Each of our National Landscapes is unique and distinct, looked after by a locally accountable partnership. But we're also part of a network of natural beauty that spans the whole country. Nature doesn't take any notice of designation boundaries. By working together as a national network we can achieve much more than we ever could by working alone.

National Landscapes are protected for the nation – a glorious part of our heritage but also vital to our future. Calling ourselves National Landscapes emphasises these areas' national importance, deserving of the highest protection. Excitingly, it also represents our ambitious collective mission to collaborate as a network for natural beauty, on behalf of everyone."

Preserving Second World War Memories in West Berkshire

We're looking for people to bring stories about their family's wartime experience so we can record and preserve them for all time



A newly launched nationwide campaign is encouraging communities to collect and digitally preserve everyday stories and objects of the Second World War for future generations.

Led by a team based at the University of Oxford and funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund, *Their Finest Hour* (https://theirfinesthour.english.ox.ac.uk/) is a new initiative working to create a comprehensive digital archive of this incredible wealth of history and knowledge that lots of us hold either in our heads or our lofts.

Many of us have war-related stories and objects that have been passed down from our parents, grandparents and other family members. The Culture and Libraries team at West Berkshire Council are looking for people to bring stories about their family's wartime experience — and associated objects such as diaries, letters, medals, journals and ration books to their Digital Collection Days to be recorded, digitised,

and then uploaded to the *Their Finest Hour* online archive, which will be free-to-use and launch in June 2024.

Janine Lewis, West Berkshire's Executive Member for Public Health, Culture, Leisure, Sport and Countryside says:

"This will be a lovely opportunity to engage with the community across different generations and to make them the guardians of this incredibly important piece of our history. It will be wonderful to preserve these wonderful, stories, memories and objects for all time. We lose so much when a generation is no longer with us and this project gives us a unique opportunity to preserve memories and history in a personal and special way that history books alone cannot share."

Dr Stuart Lee, project leader, said,

"We're delighted to be able to create an archive of memories of the Second World War. We know from previous projects that people have so many wonderful objects, photos, and anecdotes which have been passed down from family members which are at risk of getting lost or being forgotten. Our aim is to empower local communities to digitally preserve these stories and objects before they are lost to posterity."

The project team is especially interested in collecting contributions from people from underrepresented backgrounds in order to increase the diversity of people benefiting from Second World War heritage.

Household Support Fund - apply today




To further support households with the rising cost of living, we have been allocated £1.4million from the

A return to gentler rhythms as Winter creeps in.


