

West Berkshire Council

Potholes

Motorists have reported 16 times as many potholes on a district's roads than during the same period last year.

West Berkshire Council's budget meeting heard 1,881 potholes were reported between January and February this year.

In 2023, the figure for the same period was 116.

Portfolio holder for highways, housing and sustainable travel Denise Gaines said the council had spent "£400,000 more fixing these in this administration than in the last three years". She added that big potholes were being fixed within three days.

The council said it will normally repair potholes that have a 1.96in (5cm) vertical edge and are 11.81in (30cm) wide, but each pothole is assessed using a risk-based approach.

It has published diagrams of what sort of potholes will get fixed, and it has an interactive map on its website showing where they have been reported, giving them each a serial number.

Some £8.5m has been set aside to improve roads and footpaths in West Berkshire next year. Signage improvement gets £55,000, and £255,000 goes to footway improvements.

Household Waste Recycling Centre Opening Hours

Following our recent consultation, we're updating the Household Waste Recycling Centre hours for both our Padworth and Newtown Road sites. Starting from 1st April,

weekday opening hours will now be 11am to 6pm. Rest assured, weekend and bank holiday hours will continue as usual and operate 9am to 6pm, including Easter Monday.

We are making these changes to increase efficiency as both sites are not being fully utilised, meaning we have several appointments unused every day. This will also see us save approximately £59,000 annually.

National Animal Welfare Trust Trindledown Farm

We hope you're all had a lovely March and Easter!

Unfortunately, our centre is still flooded from January and the water hasn't gone down much yet. We're hoping for a dry April to help the fields dry out but so far, we are still very soggy over here! We have had lots of wildlife join us since the lake appeared and whilst they make a fantastic addition to the views, the water is causing further issues to our centre and our animals.



Owing to the condition of the fields, it's been determined that our two goats, *Woody and George*, are struggling with their limited space as they don't have the room they need to roam and climb. Therefore, the decision has been made that the two boys need to be rehomed to where they can have the space and quality of life they need. Their feet are not cut out for this swamp life and the boys miss having human interaction every day. If you know of anyone who has the space and would be interested in having two goats, please do get in touch.

Including: 'The Big Drop' farm walk

Saturday 1st June 2024, Length 2.6 miles, Start Time 2.00pm

2024 marks the 80th anniversary of the Normandy (D-Day) landings that began the liberation of Western Europe and ultimately tipped the course of the Second World War. A small farm nestled in the North Wessex Downs, just outside Boxford in West Berkshire, played a significant but top-secret

role in this world event. The valley near RAF Welford was used on 23rd March 1944 as a site for a practice for the D-Day landings. Prime Minister Churchill and Eisenhower inspected the American troops of the elite 101st Airbourne Division. This was followed by a mass parachute drop of about 3,000 men and equipment (pictured).

This event was witnessed by a small boy and his family who stood by a hedge to watch. That small boy is the owner of Court Oak Farm. We will follow a new route around the farm to learn more about this momentous occasion, see newly installed information boards with archive photos of the event as well as personal memories.

During the walk we will also learn about Court Oak Farm, a recipient of a Farming in Protected Landscapes (FiPL) grant. It is an arable farm that has been in the family for nearly 150 years. Growing mainly wheat and barley, with some oilseed rape and oats, it is now farming regeneratively. In the last few years, several miles of new hedges and have been planted to encourage wildlife.

The walk will be at a gentle pace following public rights and of way and a permitted path in a circular walk.


