Oli for Creld1 Warriors

Oli successfully completed his incredible challenge of running 7 marathons in 7 days from Chaddleworth on 15th December for Creld1.

It was a massive challenge, but Oli powered through. Despite his knee giving way early on, nothing could stop him from finishing the challenge.

Through his relentless determination, Oli managed to raise just over an astounding £60,000. This funding has already allowed vital research to begin, which brings us one step closer to understanding the gene mutation that causes Creld1, and hopefully, one day, finding a treatment for our brave warriors.





newly Creld1 discovered is genetic disorder that impacts the development and function multiple organ systems. Children with Creld1 often face severe health complications. includina defects, immune dysfunction, and neurological issues, and severe seizures. Tragically, many of these children don't survive beyond early childhood due to the relentless nature of the condition.

Angus was diagnosed with this rare disorder last summer. It was an incredibly frightening and uncertain time for us, but through connecting with other Creld1 warriors and their families, we found hope. And this is why we are committed to doing all we can to help.

We don't know what the future holds for Angus but what we do know is we will do everything we can to help him.

Two short walks – Lardon Chase (2 miles) and The Holies (3 miles) – near Streatley can be combined to create a longer figure-of-eight route taking in woodland, chalk downland and gorgeous views. Head a little further north to Dorchester on Thames for another figure-of-eight walk (5 miles) that takes you to Wittenham Clumps and the iron age hill fort there. Finally, head south into Hampshire to visit another hill fort at Ladle Hill - the highpoint of a varied 4-mile walk

scenes which stay there till Candlemass and spent afternoons at the park.



Shaw House Tudor Garden

We are very excited to share our plan to create a new Tudor Garden on the front lawns at Shaw House, with thanks to funding from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund.

The garden will be created using a mix of low maintenance hedging, flowers and herbs to create a symmetrical design in the style of a Tudor knot garden (more detailed images available soon!). The fully accessible garden will also feature raised beds and seating to enjoys the views of Shaw House.

Landscape work is due to start on Monday 20th January and our wonderful team of volunteers will then begin planting ready for public opening in Spring 2025.

Our district is a wonderful place to explore by bus. Characterised by market towns, beautiful villages and exceptional countryside, 74% of West Berkshire falls within the North Wessex Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB).
